A walk to remember

From pearl diving to date syrup, discover the history of Dubai



hen we think of Dubai, its history and heritage are pretty far down the list of traits that jump to mind – somewhere below

towering skyscrapers, extreme sports and outrageous brunches. But turn the clock back about 70 years and Dubai was not much more than a small trading port known for its pearl diving and fishing.

It's this little-known backstory that the Dubai Historical District (DHD) – along with the DHD Rejuvenation Executive Committee and Desert Gate Tourism – is hoisting up to sea level with new walking tours around the city's old quarter Khor Dubai, affectionately known as Dubai Creek.

Tales From The Past daytime tour covers all the usual tourist haunts, starting at the Heritage Village, then Sheikh Saeed Al Maktoum House (where the royal Al Maktoum family lived until 1958), then along the creek enjoying a picturesque trip in an abra across the water.

As we walk through the old neighbourhoods, our Emirati guide





shares his knowledge of the past, taking us through important times in the UAE's history and recounting how locals lived a hundred years ago. He took us through the materials Bedouins used for their camps, the techniques women used to fry up sweet luqaimat (crunchy donuts covered in date syrup), and how men would live at sea for up to five months diving for pearls.

In Deira, you'll meander through the haphazard souks, where stalls sell everything from saffron to sieves, and explore Dubai's first school, and now heritage site, Al Ahmadiya. The fourhour tour culminates in an Emirati feast inside an air-conditioned majlis.

While the tour doesn't take you off the beaten track, it's a fantastic crash course in Emirati history for residents, and a perfect guided journey for tourists keen to explore more than the malls.

CYCLE AROUND THE CREEK

Take the tour into your own hands (or handles) and explore old Dubai by bike. DISCOVER THE DESERT

Platinum Heritage might be pricier than other safari tours, but it's worth it for a real insight into Dubai's Bedouin history.
